Other possible cuts? 1. Gale courses. We get some use out of this and I wished we had the time and resources to promote this more before we get rid of it, but it is 4600 a year. Unfortunately, it just renewed and it wouldn't save us money until next August (which would still be 4600 saved from next years budget if we wouldn't be allocating it toward that next year).

- 2. Ancestry. I know someone mentioned that they don't want us to cut this, but Dorr's half is \$1030 and it renews in the spring so that's another potential savings. Complication with this one is that Hopkins would also have to agree to get rid of it since they probably wouldn't be able to carry the cost on their own.
- 3. Mango Languages. I know we have a couple of people who use this quite often, so it's another one of those that would hurt to cut, but it is a savings of about \$1360/year and it is another one that renews come spring time.
